

These events underscore the school's commitment to promoting physical fitness, teamwork, and athletic excellence, providing an enriching platform for students to showcase their talents and engage in healthy competition.

Before that various sports heats were conducted within the school, facilitating competitive opportunities for students to demonstrate their athletic prowess and engage in spirited rivalry.

- An outstation school tour for students in Grades VI to IX is scheduled from 22nd December to 27th December 2024. This excursion aims to provide enriching experiences and foster camaraderie among students as they explore new destinations.
- The NABET audit score has significantly improved, rising from 60% to 72.8% between July 2022 and 2024, with enhancements observed in 31 out of 50 parameters. This notable advancement reflects the school's commitment to continuous improvement and excellence in educational standards.

#### 5. CHALLENGES

Various challenges are encountered and addressed regularly, including:

• Traffic: Managing congestion during peak hours.

- Parking: Ensuring adequate parking facilities for students and staff.
- Half-Days: Coordinating schedules to accommodate half-day sessions.
- Long Leaves: Addressing the impact of extended absences on student learning.

- Late Submission: Establishing guidelines to enhance timely submission of assignments.
- Communication: Improving channels for effective communication between staff, students, and parents.
- Uniform & Accessories: Ensuring compliance with uniform policies and availability of required accessories.

Through concerted efforts, the school continually strives to overcome these challenges.

- Feedback and Communication Channels: The school fosters effective communication and feedback mechanisms through various channels, including:
- Parents as Judges/Guests: Engaging parents in school events and activities.
- Parent-Teacher Meetings (PTMs): Providing opportunities for direct dialogue between parents and teachers.
- WhatsApp Communication: Utilizing WhatsApp groups for timely updates and communication.
- Feedback Form Link: Facilitating easy access for parents to provide feedback on their experiences.
- Stay Back Days: Organizing days for teachers to remain available for additional support or discussions.
- Parent Pick-Up Coordination: Streamlining the process for parent pick-ups to ensure safety and efficiency.
- Emails: Encouraging the use of email for formal communication and inquiries.
- Suggestion Box: Providing a physical space for parents and staff to submit suggestions anonymously.
- Almanac: Distributing the school almanac as a comprehensive resource for important information and updates.
- Anecdotal Records: Maintaining anecdotal records to track student progress and parent feedback.

These channels collectively enhance collaboration and strengthen the school community.

#### 6. PROPOSED FEE REVISION

The Principal articulated to the esteemed members the imperative nature of a proposed fee revision scheduled for the 2025-26 academic year. This adjustment follows a two-year hiatus from any increase and is necessitated by a confluence of factors that underscore the school's commitment to excellence. The rationale behind this proposed fee revision encompasses a spectrum of considerations, including the escalation of operational expenses attributed to the inflation rate.

The management remains steadfast in its commitment to being considerate of parental concerns, assuring that the revised fee remains well within the limits established by CBSE and reflective of the diverse needs of our parent community.

All members of the forum expressed unanimous agreement regarding the proposed fee revision, acknowledging that it is indeed nominal. PTA member from Grade VII, Ms Nidhi Agnih otri, commended the school for its prudence, proposing that the fee increase is, in fact, quite modest when weighed against the superior quality of education, extensive facilities, and the diverse range of activities offered by Akshara International School. The resolution was passed collectively during the PTA meeting. This fee hike will be applicable from academic session 2025-26 and will remain the same for 2026-2027.

#### 7. GENERAL DISCUSSION:

- Grade IX PTA member, Ms. Shakti Balecha, praised the dedication of the teaching staff, noting how students enjoy attending school and showing noticeable personal development. She stated the proposed fee hike is nominal and justified, considering the exceptional educational environment. Ms. Balecha also suggested revamping the school uniform.
- The Grade VII PTA member praised the school's overall functioning, noting the competence-based paper setting that fosters critical thinking. She suggested enhancements to the LEP and recommended more math practice worksheets for deeper understanding. The Principal then briefed the forum on how the NIE planner is effectively used to improve students' language skills through newspapers.
- Grade XI PTA member, Mr. Kulkarni, commended the school's overall functioning and requested an external tour for Grade XI students. In response, Senior Coordinator Ms. Sowjanya informed the forum that Grade XI students will participate in internships and picnics, ensuring a well-rounded experience beyond academics.
- Grade X PTA member commended the school's meticulous planning, curriculum, and the dedication of the teachers. She highlighted the importance of fostering emotional intelligence (EQ) among the current generation, emphasizing the need to cultivate empathy and understanding towards those around them.

#### 8. DATE AND TIME OF NEXT MEETING

The next SEC-PTA meeting is proposed in the second week of January.

Overall, the session witnessed a healthy discussion which ended on a positive note.

The Principal expressed her heartfelt gratitude to all the PTA members for their continual support and valuable feedback. The meeting ended with a sense of pleasure and contentment for all the members.
