MINUTES OF THE MEETING:

Attended by --- EPTA members 9/12 parent representatives and 11/11 school representatives attended the meeting.

The Principal welcomed all parents and addressed various suggestions, concerns, and queries raised during the meeting. Below are the key points discussed:

- Answering to the request raised by parents to conduct Dance and GK exams under CCR the Principal explained that since Dance is a practical exam and would be conducted as regular class tests.
- 2. To the suggestion that all the classwork should be shared as pictures via daily mail the principal replied that the students should learn to share their work with their classmates who are absent and it would also increase the screen time though we would work on it and come up with a solution in the next academic year.
- 3. Replying to the concern of a lot of writing work taken in the class, the Principal clarified that since the ICSE syllabus is vast, regular writing is necessary. Teachers monitor students during writing activities, but if a child is reluctant, they cannot be forced. Parents are encouraged to give extra writing practice at home.
- 4. Short break timings will be revised after the Diwali break.
- 5. Based on parent suggestions, chapter-wise revision tests will be conducted wherever possible.
- 6. Answering to the query that in Std 1 and 2 the time table for English literature and language is not followed sir said since the English literature syllabus is completed, students are now required to bring English grammar books and the teachers are instructed to inform the parents through a diary note.
- 7. Answering to the "Anucched lekhan" the Principal suggested that such matters can be discussed individually with the concerned teacher. Regarding the uploading of worksheets he assured that it will be uploaded in advance.
- 8. EPTA members were informed that students recite multiplication tables before every Math class in the primary section.
- Regarding Art and Origami Activity Kit, A vendor demonstrated an Art and Origami Activity Kit and announced prices without school permission. The school clarified that it does not endorse vendors but only forwards useful links on PTA groups when beneficial for students.
- 10. Concern: CCR-1 exam scheduled on 11th September, immediately after Ganesh Chaturthi. The Principal explained that postponing the exam would clash with Navratri. Revision for examination should be a regular practice. However, the suggestion will be considered for next year.
- 11. Addressing to the absenteeism during Festivals, the Principal said that the students will not be penalized for missing tests due to festivals if they are internal assessments. Parents must fill leave records in the diary when students return.
- 12. Hygiene in Washrooms-The Principal assured that the admin team will monitor and improve washroom hygiene.

- 13. Answer Sheet Discussions- Students review their answer sheets in class while the answers are discussed. Teachers will work towards sensitising students who feel discouraged by low marks.
- 14. 3 A English Recitation Activity: Teachers have been advised not to ask students for opinions on competition judgments.
- 15. Teachers distribute the answer scripts of all subjects to the students, encouraging them to sort and organize their own papers. This practice not only fosters a sense of responsibility but also provides students with an opportunity to review and reflect on their performance.
- 16. The teachers will be informed to give instructions in writing about the project, assignment or homework either in the diary or homework tab regularly.
- 17. Transporter is arranging for a new bus from 1st September, 2025 for 5A route. This delay is due to unavailability of a female attendant for the bus.
- 18. School timings cannot be changed due to a packed syllabus and co-curricular schedules.
- 19. Parents of students in Std. 1 & 2 are requested to ensure toilet training of their wards.
- 20. Parents are urged to respond promptly to school emails, check diaries regularly, and sign them. Secondary section students are signing their diaries responding to whats app messages and even signing the consent form.
- 21. Teachers have been instructed to check notebooks thoroughly. Concerns will be addressed if issues persist.
- 22. For inter-school events, teachers create WhatsApp groups to update parents on schedules. A group could not be formed for one recent event; the school will ensure better coordination next time.
- 23. Scouts and Guides students can wear their uniform throughout the day; no need to carry a spare school uniform.
- 24. Daily logs are usually uploaded but may be delayed due to network issues or teacher's absence. The matter will be reviewed.
- 25. Projects are designed for students' learning, not parents' creativity. Parents should only guide but not do the work.
- 26. The school considers and allows the student to enter the school gate if it is raining or some genuine reason.
- 27. A session on Digital Detox has been conducted in the school and financial literacy sessions for Std. 9 and 10 are being conducted in the school.
- 28. All classroom clock batteries have been replaced and are now functional.
- 29. Since competitive exams are conducted by external bodies, the school cannot provide coaching. Sample papers and past papers are available in the library.
- 30. Addressing to the point exams should be conducted in a fair manner, cheating by students should be avoided, the principal said that the school ensures strict monitoring to prevent cheating and if anyone is caught cheating, the parents are called and strict actions are taken.
- 31. The school is concerned about bag weight, but some days require extra books. E-books were tried but led to reduced reading habits, more screen time and eye strain.



32. Addressing to the home work being not checked by teachers seriously the principal said that the teachers will be reminded to check homework thoroughly across all subjects.

- 33. For Math teaching new strategies and methods will be adopted to improve it.
- 34. Private vans may enter school premises only if all required documents are submitted and $\mathfrak a$ female attendant is present as per the government norms. 35. The Sports students are missing their classes in the last three periods just prior to any

- New computers are installed in computer Lab 2, so the students who opted for coding can take up coding in term 2. 38. The school has introduced NCC. We have 50 students from Std. 8 and 50 students from Std. 9.
- Std 9 students went for 8 days NCC camp to FC college. 39. Our students have got laurels to school in inter-school competitions like Debate competitions-
- Frank Anthony, inter school debate competition conducted by Bishop Co-ed School.
- 40. The Annual Day for Std. 1 and 2 was successfully conducted, an exhibition for Std. 5 is in the month of October and the Annual Day for Std.4 and 5 is in the month of November. There is a Sports Day for the secondary section, to this a member told that Std. 5 did not have Annual Day
- last year and will not have this year too as they are now in secondary section. 41. 44 students from our school are selected to represent in national competitions in various sports and 149 students for regionals.
- 42. The school successfully hosted Oratoria Debate and Model United Nations (MUN). The Principal thanked parents for encouraging student participation.
- 43. As per the guidelines of the EPTA, there should be two Joint Secretaries a parent representative and a school representative. Hence the school has nominated the school representative as Ms. Maya Ghule and out of the two parent representatives for the Joint secretary Mr Chetan Gandhi has stepped down and Mr. Abhijeet Wable continues to be the Joint
- Secretary. 44. A 15% increase in school fees is proposed for the academic years 2026-27 and 2027-28, in line with government guidelines. A detailed copy of the revised fee structure is attached below.
