- 3. Recent addition to our accolades and achievements is securing the 2nd Rank in **Bits & Brushes**, a coding competition organised by COEP, Pune on 5th October, 2024 & **Wild Wisdom Global Challenge**, organised by World WildLife held on 4th October, 2024.
- 4. We are glad to announce that in CBSE Cluster our students **U-14 Girls bagged 3rd position in Basketball** amongst 24 Schools. In ZP sports, our students reached the quarter finals going against 100+ schools in each category of sports.
- 5. In performing Arts, our students displayed exceptional performance and bagged positions in various prestigious events.
- 6. Our students went to Germany to participate in the JUKU Camp Visit a cultural exchange sponsored by PASCH. Later Sonika ma'am explained the importance of the tour that took place.
- 7. Following the footsteps of senior students, our young students are also showing their talent. Two students from the Pre-primary section, Master Gatik Yarra became the fastest kid to identify Asian

flags in the timespan of 1:20 sec and the other child Miss. Itisha Rastogi created her own written patent poem named: **OHH! MY PENCIL, WHERE ARE YOU?**

### II. FITNESS AWARD CEREMONY

- 1. Our Sports team is always sensitising students about fitness and our students are also aware of the importance of fitness. The Fitness Badge is categorised as **Gold, Silver & Bronze.**
- 2. Our Sports HOD, Mr. Naresh Singh, explained the importance of Fitness and also shared that the students are felicitated by the serving officers from the Indian Army..

### The Success of our Fitness Program:

- 1. We measure the fitness of our students on 5 parameters where the maximum score is 25.
- 2. A decent standard of fitness is a score of 16.
- 3. Over the last 2 years the overall fitness of the entire students has improved.
- 4. For example: 2 years ago in the academic Year 2022-23, about 70% of the students were able to achieve this.
- 5. Now in the Academic Year 2024-25, 80% of the students are able to achieve this standard.
- 6. Also our fitness is higher when compared to students from other schools. We have a method of assessing this. Only 50% of the students who take admission with us directly in class 5 are able to achieve a score of 16.

#### III. <u>FEE REVISION:</u>

- At Sanskriti we follow the Biennial fee revision cycle.
- The last fee revision was done for Academic Years 2023-24 and 2024-25.
- The upcoming revision is for Academic Years 2025-26 and 2026-27.
- The revision has been tabled to absorb the rising costs.

#### V. STUDENTS' POLL:

- 1. Suvarna ma'am, explained the process of polling. Our Student Council members played a major role in making the students aware about the options. Their active participation helped us in the polling process. After the students were informed about the options by the Council members, the polls were carried out. Children were asked to cast their votes to select an activity. These votes were then counted and the chosen activity was announced to the students in the auditorium.
- 2. The Choices that were given were-
  - DARE club- Drone, Al, Robotics and Electronics.
  - Rock Climbing Wall
  - Digital Art Studio
  - Career Counselling

The Rock climbing wall option won by a good margin over the DARE club. The Students were happy with the polling results. Their excitement was visible on their faces. Polling gives a student much more responsibility & gives them the power to make decisions.

The Rock Climbing Wall will be ready in the next academic year.

#### **Question & Answer:**

Q. How is the flexibility of the students rated?

Ans. Naresh sir explained that flexibility is related to bone, spine, and stretching of legs or hands. He also told them about a few exercises to develop the same. Those students who have less flexibility are directed to yoga sessions for development. He even advised parents to let the students do yoga stretching at home, it will also help in their posture and bending.

Request from parents to share some videos on the topic, so that they are aware of the same and can perform it.

They were informed that the criteria on which fitness was judged, would be explained and also shared with them along with videos detailing various exercises to improve their fitness standards.

Q. How young students identified the process of polling and concluded their selection?

Ans. The important role here was played by the council members, who explained to the children the options they were given and the criteria of selection they could make.

Q. What kind of precautions are taken by the school to prevent students from taking the extreme step due to stress?

Ans. In such cases, our heads explained to the parents that it is not only school but the responsibility of parents too to keep an eye on the mood swings and behavioural changes of the child and motivate and sensitize them.

We have our wellness team and the teachers, who regularly keep a check on students according to the information shared by the team members. These observations are further shared with parents too, to come up with the solution.

Children's failure should not be treated as a failure in life at any stage. It becomes an emotional loss along with a loss in confidence. Here we need to work as a team to boost him/her and motivate him/her to go ahead.

Also, we have stress management programs planned for higher-grade students to counsel them for the Grade-X preparations. It is also done for your younger kids who appear for UTs.

Orientation programs are organised for the parents and students before the session's start to sensitise parents on the crucial time students will be facing and where parents need to support and help students.

2. Concerns raised by a group of committee members regarding the correction of books or Notebooks and pending work needs to be completed.

Ans. Parents were assured that random checks of the notebooks will be carried out. Parents were also explained about the notebook correction monitoring done by the Heads.

One of the parents advised us to share the syllabus for the terms so that parents are aware of the same, in case notes are incomplete.

Q. Language subject and the writing part for the student is creating problems, they are unable to concentrate. What measures can be taken?

Ans. Students facing problems in languages can learn the speech or accent of the language, as the script for Marathi is the same as Hindi. One of the parents suggested that the students should read, write at least 5 lines, and speak on a daily basis to have a command on the language.

One of the parents apprised everyone that 60–70% of students are taking help from YouTube to learn tasks, which is not advisable.

Q. In case homework is given but the books or NBs are not sent to home. What needs to be done in such a case?

Ans. They were informed that it would be looked into. One of the parents has also said that students are taking other students' books either intentionally or unintentionally and keeping the books/NBs back after the exam.

Q. Is the path being used in the backyard of the school proper?

Ans. Yogesh sir apprised the parents of the maintenance that we have taken to make it proper and usable. The only problem happens on rainy days when we make alternate arrangements.

Q. Parents raised a concern on the cleanliness of the washroom, how is it managed?

Ans. The heads informed everyone that the washrooms were cleaned at regular intervals. Parents were informed that teachers also use the same washrooms. It is our prime responsibility to teach students about the use of washrooms and the way they are used at home; the same should be followed at school.

Our Tais play an important role in cleaning it on time, filling up the hand wash as soon as it finishes, and helping younger students use washrooms.
